## Parish Council

The first PC meeting for this year had a full agenda and it was great to have some residents and guests attend the meeting. Key items included:

- residents speaking in the Open Forum about the A508 and the speed/noise of traffic with particular reference to HGVs during the night. The Council have had ongoing discussions with Highways and other relevant agencies about actions that can be taken to reduce the speed on the road through the village and actions including the change of speed limits, hatchings at the side of the road and the speed indicator signs have been implemented. Whilst Highways are sympathetic to the issue, their advice has always remained that the A508 is part of the strategic network through the county and this, along with the geography of the road, restricts actions that can be taken. The Council have suggested that they invite Highways, the police, our District Councillor and MP to a meeting where residents can express their concerns and frustrations directly. We will widely advertise this meeting once a date has been identified.
- requests for support with funding from Maidwell Primary School and Draughton Club Room. The Chair of the school governors outlined the challenges facing the school and raised two particular issues the school would like help with: replacement of obsolete laptops and help with external maintenance works. The Chair of the Club Room outlined the extensive work to complete the refurbishment. The PC have agreed, in principle, that both these causes are important to support and have asked both organisations to come back to the Council with more specific packages of work that could be funded. These will be discussed at the next meeting.

- Budget 2026/27 - the Council signed off the proposed budget for the next financial year. Our current budget is £11,999 and our proposed budget for next year is £11,940. This enables the precept to remain the same for residents and provides us with sufficient cover for our projected costs as well as potential support for community activities.
- The Council noted a planning application for a new property in Draughton, using an existing old barn as the core structure. We have neither supported nor objected to this application.

The next meeting will take place on **Wednesday 11 March at 7.30pm** in the Loder Hall and, as always, all residents are welcome to attend.
